- Understand why World Heritage Sites are chosen, where they are and what special features they have.
- Understand what makes Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and Canal a World Heritage Site and how it compares to other World Heritage Sites.
- Develop key skills including investigation, speaking and listening and digital competence skills.

Activities

- 1. Use the Discovering World Heritage Sites PowerPoint game as a starting point to guess World Heritage Sites around the world and discuss why these have been chosen.
- 2. Watch the films to understand more about World Heritage and to find out more about Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and Canal and why it became a World Heritage Site.
- 3. Play the World Heritage Site card game and then create your own World Heritage Site cards using the templates. Ask the questions: Why are the sites special? Where are they? What type of World Heritage Site are they?
- 4. Become World Heritage tour guides: Read our tour guide's top tips then use Mantle of the Expert to create a tour guide company and become experts and create your own virtual tour using your chosen World Heritage Sites.
